Week One

Monday. *Construction Safety Awareness Course.* (DGS-CSAC 38964-08) One day safety awareness Certificate course familiarizes new or experienced construction job seekers with a program, originally pioneered in Western Canada. The program has received critical acclaim from industry, and is an absolute must for those entering the construction industry concerned with safety for themselves and co-workers in the construction workplace.

Tuesday & Wednesday. *TCP Traffic Control Low/Moderate Risk Course* (DGS - TCP 57742-08) Two day course. In the Province of British Columbia, WorkSafeBC states, "*that in moderate risk situations, the comprehensive TCP training for high risk workplaces is not neccessary*". However, training for Low/Moderate Risk Workplace TCP's, must address at a minimum the points described below. This course addresses training that includes an overview of basic traffic control techniques, including setting up and taking down of basic traffic control devices at a work site, proper hand signals, and proper positioning. Instruction on personal protective clothing, and safety equipment, responding to aggressive drivers, identifying an escape route, and reporting of near misses and incidences that occur. This TCP training for low/moderate risk workplaces includes, in class coursework, as well as practical practice sessions in a controlled environment. Training at this level may be delivered by an employer or a third party.

Thursday & Friday *Fall Protection Course* (DGS-FPC 87854-08) Two day Fall Protection Course. Fall Protection is required to teach employees who might be exposed to fall hazards how to recognize such hazards and how to minimize them. Participants are trained in the following areas: (a) the nature of fall hazards in the work area; (b) the correct procedures for erecting, maintaining, disassembling, and inspecting fall protection systems; (c) the use and operation of controlled access zones and guardrail, personal fall arrest, safety net, warning line, and safety monitoring systems; (d) the role of each employee in the safety monitoring system when the system is in use; (e) the limitations on the use of mechanical equipment during the performance of roofing work on low-sloped roofs; (f) the correct procedures for equipment and materials handling and storage and the erection of overhead protection; and (g) employee's role in fall protection plans.

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Saturday & Sunday SDCB Forklift Course & Narrow Aisle Stand up Reach Truck Course - Combined (DGS-SDCB 77804-08/DGS - SUPNA 799-08) Two day Course. Training covers truck-related topics including all operating instructions, warnings, and precautions for the types of trucks the operator will operate; differences between the truck and the automobile; controls and instrumentation: location, what they do, and how they work; engine or motor operation; steering and maneuvering; visibility (including restrictions due to loading); fork and attachment adaptation; operation, and use limitations; vehicle capacity (weight and load center); vehicle stability (with and without load and attachments); vehicle inspection and maintenance the operator will be required to perform; refueling and/or charging and recharging batteries; operating limitations and instructions, warning, or precautions for the type of vehicle which the employee is being trained to operate. Saturday covers classroom / Theory / Written Test. Sunday covers Driving / Operating Test and includes Stand up Narrow Aisle Reach.

Week Two

Monday WHMIS Course (DGS-WHMIS 44303-08) One day Course. The Workplace Hazardous Materials Information System (WHMIS) is Canada’s hazard communication standard. The key elements of the system are cautionary labelling of containers of WHMIS “controlled products”, the provision of material safety data sheets (MSDSs) and worker education programs. WHMIS is implemented through coordinated federal, provincial and territorial legislation. Supplier labelling and MSDS requirements are set out under the Hazardous Products Act and associated Controlled Products Regulations. The Hazardous Products Act and its regulations are administered by the Government of Canada Department of Health, commonly referred to as Health Canada. Familiarity with WHMIS information and requirements for both management and workers is a must for successful job seekers in today’s competitive environment.

Tuesday & Wednesday Warehouse Safety Course (DGS-WHSC 97355-08) Two day Warehouse Course. covers Why Work Safely, What Is Working Safely, Company Responsibility, Your Responsibility, General Safety Rules, Blood-borne Pathogens, Personal Protective Equipment, Electrical Safety, Lockout Tagout – Control of Hazardous Energy, Emergency Action, Housekeeping, Fire Prevention, Visitors, Chemicals (Hazard Communication: Your Right-to-Know, Cause of Accidents & Injuries, Safe Lifting – Back Injury Prevention, Ergonomics, Personal Hygiene & Sanitation, and Personal Responsibility for Safety. Great for companies, supervisors, job seekers, and those looking for promotion.
